



# California Regulatory Notice Register

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The *California Regulatory Notice Register* is an official state publication of the Office of Administrative Law containing notices of proposed regulatory actions by state regulatory agencies to adopt, amend or repeal regulations contained in the California Code of Regulations. The effective period of a notice of proposed regulatory action by a state agency in the *California Regulatory Notice Register* shall not exceed one year [Government Code § 11346.4(b)]. It is suggested, therefore, that issues of the *California Regulatory Notice Register* be retained for a minimum of 18 months.

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## PROPOSED ACTION ON REGULATIONS

### TITLE 4. DEPARTMENT OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Department of Food and Agriculture (Department) proposes to amend regulations contained in Title 4, Division 9, Chapter 6, Article 5. Assembly Bill 1618 (AB 1618, Stats. 2001, Ch. 596—Matthews) authorizes the Department to grant a variance for developmental engine fuels providing specific conditions are met.

The Department would only grant authorization for the purpose of evaluating developmental engine fuels as part of a standards development process. The granting of a variance would allow for the collection of data to assist in the creation of generally accepted chemical and performance standards for developmental engine fuels. Sales of fuels authorized by the Department are not subject to restrictions imposed upon the sale of non-conforming fuel products as set forth in Business and Professions Code (B & P Code) Sections 13441, 13442 and 13451.

The proposed amendment establishes a procedure for the Department to grant authorization, subject to terms and conditions, including reporting requirements, for the creation of data associated with standards development. Given the lack of uniformity among developmental engine fuels, the inability to predict the composition and use of future ones, and the variable circumstances in which their sale may be authorized, the Department must, by necessity, establish reporting requirements on a case-by-case basis. The Department has made the finding that the reports required of businesses authorized to sell developmental engine fuels are necessary for the health, safety, or welfare of the people of California.

The Department retains the authority to revoke authorization at any time if the authorization holder has violated any of the terms and conditions of the authorization, or, alternatively, abandoned efforts toward the creation of generally accepted chemical and performance standards. The authorization will automatically cease, without any action by the Department, after the creation of a generally accepted chemical and performance standard for the fuel.

Finally, the Department has determined that the proposed regulations will allow engine fuel producers to utilize, for testing and data gathering purposes, developmental engine fuels that are designed to comply with the California Air Resources Board NOx low emission air quality standards.

A public hearing regarding this proposal is not currently scheduled. However, any interested person or duly authorized representative may request, no later than 15 days prior to the close of the written comment period, that a public hearing be scheduled.

Following the public hearing, if one is requested, or following the written comment period, if no public hearing is requested, the Department of Food and Agriculture, upon its own motion or at the instance of any interested person, may thereafter adopt the proposal substantially as set forth without further notice.

Notice is also given that any interested person, or his or her authorized representative, may submit written comments relevant to the proposed regulatory action to the Department of Food and Agriculture, Division of Measurement Standards, 8500 Fruitridge Road, Sacramento, California 95826. #### INFORMATIVE DIGEST/POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

The Department and the Division of Measurement Standards' Petroleum Products Program are charged with the responsibility to establish specifications for engine fuels sold in California. The Department is required to adopt, by reference, the latest standards of a recognized consensus organization or standards writing organization, such as the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM). The Department has adopted ASTM standards for gasoline, diesel fuel, kerosene, and fuel oil.

In the absence of such consensus standards, the Department is still statutorily required to establish specifications for engine fuels. (B & P Code Sections 13440 and 13450.) According to the legislative history of 1993 amendments to Business and Professions Code Section 13401, "AB 2154 requires the Department of Food and Agriculture to establish specifications for gasoline and other automotive spark-ignition engine fuels, and for compression-ignition engine fuel, kerosene and fuel oil. In adopting these specifications it is the intent of the Department to adopt by reference the latest standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM). If there are no ASTM standards for a particular fuel, the Department shall adopt an interim standard established by a recognized

consensus organization or standards writing organization. If the ASTM later adopts a standard, it shall be the recognized standard.” (Historical and Statutory Notes, West’s Annotated California Codes, 2001 Cumulative Pocket Part, B & P Code, Section 13401.)

Manufacturers of developmental engine fuels will be permitted to market their fuels under conditions outlined in the authorization granted by the Department. By granting authorization, the Department will initiate a process resulting in the creation of chemical and performance data required for the approval of a consensus standard specification related to a particular developmental engine fuel. It can take two years or more to adopt consensus standards through an organization such as ASTM.

The proposed regulation would allow the Department to grant authorization to use developmental engine fuels for the sole purpose of evaluating new engine fuel technology, with the additional benefit of improved air quality.

**Section 4144**

This section is added to explain and clarify the provisions of Assembly Bill 1618 (AB 1618, Stats. 2001, Ch. 596—Matthews), signed into law on October 9, 2001 as an urgency statute. AB1618 placed Section 13405 in the Business and Professions Code, Division 5, Chapter 14. It gives the Department the authority to grant a variance from the specifications of Chapter 14 for developmental engine fuels if specified conditions are met. This proposal would enable the Department to authorize the sale of these fuels to selected fleets of vehicles and other equipment, including diesel power generators, for the purpose of gathering the data needed to assist in the development of consensus standards for these fuels. In the absence of the proposed regulation, such sales are prohibited. The proposed regulation will therefore enable the Department to fulfill its statutory obligation to establish standards for developmental engine fuels, and encourage the development and use of alternative fuels to maintain air quality.

**COST TO LOCAL AGENCIES AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS**

The Secretary has initially determined that this proposal does not impose a mandate on local agencies or school districts.

The Secretary also has initially determined that this action will involve no costs or savings to any state agency, no nondiscretionary costs or savings to local agencies or school districts, no reimbursable costs or savings to local agencies or school districts under Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of the Government Code, and no costs or savings in federal funding to the State.

**EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS**

The Department has made an initial determination that the proposed action will not affect housing costs.

**SIGNIFICANT STATEWIDE ADVERSE ECONOMIC IMPACT DIRECTLY AFFECTING BUSINESS**

The Department has made an initial determination that the proposal will not have a statewide adverse economic impact directly affecting business, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states.

**COST IMPACTS ON REPRESENTATIVE PRIVATE PERSON OR BUSINESS**

The Department is not aware of any cost impacts that a representative private person or business would necessarily incur in reasonable compliance with the proposed action.

**ASSESSMENT REGARDING EFFECT ON JOB/BUSINESSES**

The Department has made an assessment that the proposed regulation may: (1) create jobs within California; (2) create new businesses within California; or (3) affect the expansion of businesses currently doing business in California.

**ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED**

The Secretary must determine that no reasonable alternative considered by the agency or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the agency would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the action is proposed or would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed action.

**AUTHORITY**

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code, Division 5, Sections 12027 and 13405.

**REFERENCE**

The Department proposes to amend the current regulations to implement, interpret, and make specific the provisions of the Business and Professions Code, Sections 13401, 13440 and 13450.

EFFECT ON SMALL BUSINESS

The Department has made an assessment that the proposed regulations will affect small business. The impact is expected to be positive in that it will allow businesses to sell developmental engine fuels while they are gathering data to design permanent consensus standards.

The Department has prepared an initial statement of reasons for the proposed action, has available all the information upon which its proposal is based, and has available the express terms of the proposed action. **TITLE 4. CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD**

BENEFICIARIES, WELFARE PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

The California Horse Racing Board (Board) proposes to amend the regulation described below after considering all comments, objections or recommendations regarding the proposed action.

PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION

The Board proposes to amend Rule 2050, Beneficiaries, Welfare Programs and Activities, of the California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Division 4. The proposed amendment would extend the eligibility for the charitable corporation's (California Thoroughbred Horsemen's Foundation (CTHF)) benefits to ex-backstretch workers who apply within twelve

months of being laid off or leaving the industry. It would also clarify the term "dependent" by specifying that a dependent is the dependent spouse or child of the person who is eligible for benefits. Additionally, the amendment to Rule 2050 will increase the allowable administrative expense of the charitable foundation from ten percent of the total expenditures for any fiscal year to fifteen percent.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Board will hold a public hearing starting at **10:00 a.m., Thursday, June 6, 2002**, or as soon after that as business before the Board will permit, at the **Bay Meadows Race Track, 2600 South Delaware Street, San Mateo, California**. At the hearing, any person may present statements or arguments orally or in writing about the proposed action described in the informative digest. It is requested, but not required, that persons making oral comments at the hearing submit a written copy of their testimony at the hearing.

AUTHORITY AND REFERENCE

INFORMATIVE DIGEST/POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

Rule 2050, Beneficiaries, Welfare Programs and Activities, provides that eligibility for welfare fund benefits shall be limited to natural persons who engage in occupations directly related to the physical care of horses at California racetracks and their dependents. The rule also provides that administrative costs



necessary to administer, supervise and audit the operations of the CTHF not exceed ten percent of the total expenditures for any fiscal year.

The amendment to Rule 2050 will extend eligibility for CTHF benefits to ex-backstretch workers who apply within twelve months after being laid off or leaving the industry. It will provide for the possibility of charitable assistance for ex-backstretch workers and their dependents, and provide them with time to find alternative health care coverage. In requesting the amendment, the CTHF stated that needy backstretch workers and their primary dependents have earned the privilege of consideration for coverage after they have ceased working.

The term "dependent" has been clarified under the amendment to Rule 2050. The CTHF asked that the rule be amended to clarify the meaning of dependent by stating that a dependent is the dependent spouse or child of the person who is eligible for benefits. The change will help reduce the financial exposure of the CTHF while clarifying eligibility for all concerned.

The CTHF is an operating foundation. It does not have an endowment, so it must actively authorize and monitor its administrative expenses, while constantly seeking new sources of funding. The CTHF has two clinics to maintain with an operating budget of two million dollars. The CTHF has found it difficult to operate with fewer than four administrative staff and maintain a proper separation of duties. The current ten percent allowable administrative expense has become an obstacle in CTHF's efforts to operate. An increase in its allowable administrative expense to fifteen percent will allow the CTHF to maintain proper approvals and internal controls.

### TITLE 4. CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD

#### DESIGNATION AND APPROVAL OF HORSEMEN'S WELFARE FUND

The California Horse Racing Board (Board) proposes to amend the regulation described below after considering all comments, objections or recommendations regarding the proposed action.

#### PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION

The Board proposes to amend Rule 2049, Designation and Approval of Horsemen's Welfare Fund, of the California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Division 4. The proposed amendment would expand the number of directors required under the rule from five, to a minimum of five and a maximum of nine. The proposed amendment would also change the number

of directors who shall not have a financial interest in horse racing from two directors, to forty percent of the total number of directors, and require that one director without financial interest in horse racing be selected pursuant to Business and Professions Code Section 19641.2(c).

#### INFORMATIVE DIGEST/POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

Rule 2049, Designation and Approval of Horsemen's Welfare Fund, provides that the charitable corporation organized by the horsemen's organization

shall have five directors who are subject to Board approval. The recognized charitable corporation of the horsemen's organization is the California Thoroughbred Horsemen's Foundation, Inc. (CTHF). Rule 2049 provides that directors of the CTHF may also be directors of the horsemen's organization if at least two of the directors have no financial interest in horse racing as a licensed horse owner, trainer, or assistant trainer and are not a current member of the horsemen's organization. The CTHF has asked the Board to amend Rule 2049 to provide for additional directors, and to change the number of directors having no financial interest in horse racing.

The proposed amendment to Rule 2049 will allow the CTHF to expand its board of directors. Currently the maximum number of directors is five. The proposed amendment will authorize the CTHF to have a minimum of five and a maximum of nine directors. An expanded CTHF board of directors will provide it with the opportunity to appoint directors who would bring both financial means and a network of contacts to potentially assist the CTHF. Additional directors will also provide the opportunity for existing directors to educate and cultivate new directors without the need to replace the existing directors. This will allow for continuity in CTHF activities and decision making.

The current CTHF board of directors is composed of five persons. Rule 2049 requires that two of the directors have no financial interest in horse racing. Two equals forty percent of the five board members. The proposed amendment to Rule 2049 will keep this requirement in place by dropping the "two out of five" language and specifying that forty percent of the directors have no financial interest in horse racing—regardless of the number of directors.

Assembly Bill 471, Chapter 198, Statutes of 2001, added B&P Code Section 19641.2 to require that the charitable corporation select at least one director or trustee without financial interest in horse racing from a list of nominees jointly submitted by the California State Council of the Service Employees International Union, the Jockeys' Guild, and the California Teamsters Public Affairs Council. The amendment to Rule 2049 will require that the charitable corporation select one director or trustee without financial interest in horse racing pursuant to B&P Code Section 19641.2(c).

#### TITLE 19. OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Fire Marshal proposes to amend the proposed regulations described below after considering all comments, objections or recommendations regarding the proposed action.

#### PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION

The State Fire Marshal proposes to amend Section 557.9, 560, 560.2, 567, 574.6, 575, 575.1, 575.3, 575.4, 578.1, 578.10, 591.5, 594.3, 594.5, 595.9, 595.10, 595.14, 596, 596.1, 596.2, and 596.3 of Title 19 of the California Code of Regulations.

This regulatory action modifies several regulations specific to portable fire extinguishers to align California's regulations with recognized National standards including those found in NFPA 10, Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers, [1998 edition]. Other regulatory recommendations where the CSFM has not utilized this standard were done to provide increased enforcement to protect the public from unscrupulous fire extinguisher companies as well as various programmatic needs.

**AUTHORITY AND REFERENCE**

The State Fire Marshal is proposing this regulatory action pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 13160, 13161, and 13162.

**INFORMATIVE DIGEST—POLICY OVERVIEW**

It is the State Fire Marshal's (CSFM) policy to maintain program-related regulations by continuously reviewing the existing regulations against the national standards (when applicable). In response to industry and local government requests as well as organizational needs, the CSFM reviews existing regulations and makes recommendation to update them. The CSFM utilized a Fire Extinguisher Advisory Committee to make recommendations on revising these regulations. The CSFM has worked with this committee on some of the proposed regulations.

**MODIFIED SECTIONS**

The following sections have been modified to clarify the intent of the regulations without changing the scope or application of the regulations. These sections are:

The following sections have been amended with the justification as shown:

**SECTION 557.9 (b). "I" Definitions.**

Summary: This section requires an internal maintenance tag.

Proposed Action: To eliminate a definition which is no longer needed.

**SECTION 560 (f). General Provisions and Fee Schedule.**

Summary: This section requires a \$125.00 fee associated with a change in business location.

Proposed Action: To expand this section to allow the CSFM to recover its costs by assessing a fee anytime a licensee requests a licensing revision, which necessitates a physical inspection by a State Fire Marshal.

**SECTION 560.2 (b)(6). Deceptive Practices.**

Summary: This section will provide clear direction to the industry that they will have to obtain the business owner or their representative approval of an estimate of what the work will cost and give them the final approval prior to any work beginning. This will limit the practice of fire extinguisher technicians starting service activities without the prior authorization of the business owner or their representative and then giving the business owner a final bill when the work is completed.

Proposed Action: This action is required in response to one of the most often identified complaints received by the CSFM regarding retail portable fire extinguisher concerns.

**SECTION 567 (f). Distribution of Fire Extinguishers**

Summary: The table reference was not changed the last time the regulations were amended

Proposed Action: To reference the correct table.

**SECTION 574.6 (a) (b). Record keeping.**

Summary: This section provides a methodology on how portable fire extinguishers should be maintained on a monthly basis by the business owner.

Proposed Action: Specify how the monthly inspection records shall be kept for portable fire extinguishers.

**SECTION 575. Servicing, General.**

Summary: All fire extinguishers are to be serviced in accordance with the manufacture's requirements. This would necessitate a service company maintain current service manuals in order to comply with the regulations. A scale is required to sell chemical and powder by weight in California.

Proposed Action: Currently, a service company is not required to maintain and utilize a current fire extinguisher service manual even though all fire extinguishers are to be serviced in accordance with the manufacture's requirements. Not servicing a portable fire extinguisher in accordance with the manufacture's requirements voids the UL listing. A service company will also be required to have and use a calibrated scale.

**SECTION 575.1 (f) (g) (h) (i). Maintenance and Required Service Intervals.**

Summary: This section provides a clear direction to the industry that they will have to allow the business owner or their representative to approve an estimate of what the work will cost and give them the final approval prior to any work beginning. This will also specify that a final invoice listing the work done and any parts replaced on any fire extinguishers, be provided to the business owner or their representative. This will limit the practice of fire extinguisher technicians starting service activities without the prior authorization of the business owner or their representative and then giving the business owner a final bill.

This action will also require that any replaced fire extinguisher parts be returned to the fire extinguisher owner or owner's representative except those to be returned under a warranty arrangement.

Proposed Action: This action is required in response to some of the most frequently identified complaints received by the CSFM regarding retail portable fire extinguisher concerns.

**SECTION 575.3 (a) (c) Maintenance Procedures.**

Summary: This section specifies the annual tear down frequency and reiterates that the service company is also required to have a scale.

Proposed Action: This section will now align California's tear down frequency for dry chemical and dry powder stored pressure fire extinguishers with the national standard for a six year tear down. A calibrated scale is required to sell chemical and powder by weight in California.

**SECTION 575.4 (a)(1) Maintenance Procedures.**

Summary: Currently in California, the tear down frequency for portable fire extinguishers is on an annual basis and this revision would adopt the NFPA 10 frequency, which is every six years.

Proposed Action: To adopt the NFPA 10 frequency requirement.

**578.1 (d) Recharging, General**

Summary: Currently, a service company is required to have a scale.

Proposed Action: To specify that a calibrated scale will be required to sell chemical and powder by weight in California.

**578.10 (a) Leak Test.**

Summary: Currently, the regulations specify that a leak test shall be performed on a portable fire extinguisher.

Proposed Action: This section would further specify that a leak test shall be performed and the procedures to be used to accomplish a leak test.

**591.5 Replacement Extinguishers.**

Summary: To ensure that the customer is left with a fire extinguisher that is at least equal to what they originally had and that it is done in compliance with Title 19.

Proposed Action: This action is required in response to a frequent complaint received by the CSFM that certain retail portable fire extinguisher concerns are leaving a replacement fire extinguisher that is of poor quality and not comparable to what the consumer owned.

**594.3 (a) 1,2,3,4. Test Equipment for Low Pressure Non-D.O.T. Specification Cylinders and Hose Assemblies.**

Summary: This section specifies the equipment and licensing requirements for testing fire extinguisher equipment.

Proposed Action: To conform to NFPA 10 and specify the equipment and licensing requirements for servicing non-D.O.T. specification cylinders. This is a safety issue for the individual performing the service and the CSFM needs to specify the type of equipment, which is required

**594.5 (c) (4) Recording of Tests**

Summary: This section provides a documentation process for low-pressure (non-D.O.T.) Cylinders.

Proposed Action: Currently there is no written documentation required for non-D.O.T. Cylinders. It has come to the attention of the CSFM, that some portable fire extinguisher concerns are charging customers for hydrostatic testing, but not actually performing the service.

**595.5 (a) (3) Fire Extinguisher License Types.**

Summary: This section defines the type of license required for servicing fire extinguishers.

Proposed Action: To further define the two elements of this license, which can include D.O.T. cylinders and non-D.O.T. cylinders, and the requirement that a fire extinguisher company possess the necessary test equipment.

**595.5 (f) Fire Extinguisher License Types.**

Summary: The CSFM is currently using a self-certification process for the concern license.

Proposed Action: To ensure that any prospective licensee has the documented experience to operate a concern. This will provide a basis to evaluate an individual's experience to ensure that a license is issued to only qualified individuals.

**595.9 (f) Certificates of Registration.**

Summary: The Fire Extinguisher Industry has requested that the CSFM implement a mandatory training program to ensure that qualified individuals are working in this industry.

Proposed Action: This new section will provide a basis to evaluate an individual's experience to ensure that a license is issued to only qualified individuals. This will ensure that applicant's possess the basic knowledge to obtain a certificate of registration and have a level of expertise to safely perform fire extinguisher service work.

**595.10 (c) Examination Procedures.**

Summary: Currently, the CSFM has no process in place to require any type of retesting of licensees.

Proposed Action: This change will give the CSFM more flexibility in requiring additional testing of applicants and will facilitate the implementation of a proposed program of recurrent testing and training.

**595.14 (a) (b) Mobile Service Vehicles.**

Summary: Currently, the CSFM has no specific process in place dealing with mobile service vehicles.



Proposed Action: A new requirement to aid in enforcement and to prevent fraudulent practices by service technicians who operate out of a service vehicle.

**596 (c) General.**

Summary: This section requires that an internal maintenance tag be used.

Proposed Action: The references in the regulations to the Internal Maintenance tag are no longer needed since the Internal Maintenance tag has been eliminated as a requirement.

**596.1 (a) (10) Required Information.**

Summary: There is no requirement that a licensed concern print the telephone number of their concern license location on the annual maintenance tag.

Proposed Action: This is an enforcement tool, which will allow the State Fire Marshal or his/her designee to contact the licensed company at the business location they are operating at. Most companies already provide this on their tag, but for consistency purposes, it needs to be specified.

**596.1 (d) (8) Required Information.**

Summary: The hydrostatic test labels must have the 6-yr maintenance information.

Proposed Action: To correct a change which was made in the last regulatory filing where the 6-yr maintenance component was inadvertently deleted.

**596.2 (b) Size and Color and Material**

Summary: There is no longer a requirement that an internal maintenance tag be used.

Proposed Action: The references in the regulations to the Internal Maintenance tag are no longer needed since the Internal Maintenance tag has been eliminated as a requirement.

**596.3 (b) Attaching Tag.**

Summary: There is no longer a requirement that an internal maintenance tag be used.

Proposed Action: The references in the regulations to the Internal Maintenance tag are no longer needed since the Internal Maintenance tag has been eliminated as a requirement.

**SMALL BUSINESS EFFECTS**

The State Fire Marshal has made an initial determination that the amendments to these regulations may have a significant statewide adverse economic impact on business. The SFM anticipates that the proposed change in teardown frequency may adversely affect the entire fire extinguisher servicing industry. The proposed regulations will directly affect small businesses; small fire extinguisher service companies will have a reduced revenue stream and may be adversely effected as they are not as diversified as the larger full service fire extinguisher companies. Conversely, private persons and business owners who are required to maintain a portable fire extinguisher may realize a slight savings from the change of tear down frequency change.

**CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES**

No alternatives considered by the State Fire Marshal would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the regulations are proposed, or would be as effective or less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed regulations. The CSFM anticipates the adoption of these regulations will affect the portable fire extinguisher industry.

The State Fire Marshal invites interested persons to present statements or arguments with respect to alternatives to the proposed regulations at the scheduled hearing or during the written comment period.

The listing of *naphthalene* is effective **April 19, 2002**.

*Naphthalene* (CAS # 91-20-3) is listed as a chemical known to the State to cause cancer. The listing of *naphthalene* is based on a formal identification by an authoritative body that the chemical causes cancer pursuant to an administrative listing mechanism provided under Proposition 65. Regulations governing the listing of chemicals under the "authoritative bodies" mechanism are published in Title 22, California Code of Regulations, Section 12306 (22 CCR 12306).

The reader is directed to the *Notice of Intent to List Naphthalene* published in the October 19, 2001, issue of the *California Regulatory Notice Register* (Register 01, No. 42-Z) for the supporting documentation for the chemical *naphthalene*, which OEHHA relied upon in making its determination that the criteria for administrative listing have been satisfied.

A complete, updated chemical list is published elsewhere in this issue of the *California Regulatory Notice Register*.

In summary, the following chemical is added to the Proposition 65 chemical list as *known to the State to cause cancer*:

#### SUMMARY OF PETITION

Petitioner requests that the Department of Corrections adopt regulations to be incorporated into the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Division 3, to include changes to existing provisions concerning Appeal Time Limits (§ 3084.6) and Legal Duplicating Services for inmates (§ 3162). A new subsection 3084.6 (b)(7) would specify that any staff failure to complete and return appeal paperwork within the time-frame specified in the section in question would constitute a formal denial at the level involved and appellants could then file at the next level. Likewise, new subsection 3162 (c) would include among the documents covered in the legal duplicating services provided inmates by this section, a copy of the Inmate/Parolee Appeal Form and "all supporting documents" after each staff response to the appeal. The petitioner believes adoption of these two provisions will prevent problems of "untimeliness" and loss of documents during the administrative appeal process prior to a subsequent court action based on that appeal and will prevent needless litigation over delayed or lost appeal paperwork.

#### DEPARTMENT DECISION

The Director of Corrections denies the petition to adopt new regulations to change appeal time limits and legal duplicating services for inmates.

While it is the goal of the Department to respond to every inmate appeal, at every level, in a timely manner, to consider an appeal denied because staff fails to meet time constraints would defeat the purpose of the appeals system. The appeals process was established to enable staff to resolve inmate/parolee issues at the lowest possible level. There are sometimes justified reasons for delays in responding to inmate/parolee appeals and to deem a late response an automatic denial, as is requested by the petitioner, would only create an additional and unnecessary

burden upon the next level in the appeals system or the courts. If the inmate's problem can actually be resolved at the lower level, albeit in an untimely manner, such an outcome is preferable to elevating the matter to an appeal at the next higher level.

The Director similarly denies the petition to amend existing regulations to provide that inmate appellants be given a copy of their appeal and all supporting documents each time they submit an appeal, at each level. The Department is cognizant of its obligation to see that inmates' access to the courts is not impeded, but the petition would result in unnecessary duplication and waste.

Each time an appeal is acted upon (responded to), at any level, the inmate appellant is returned the entire appeal and supporting documentation. Therefore, at the conclusion of the appeal process, the inmate has those documents to attach to a subsequent civil complaint. Department staff routinely makes the number of copies that are required by the courts for inmates to maintain their lawsuits.

Although appeals paperwork is sometimes lost by staff and by the inmates/parolees themselves, Appeals Coordinators at each institution maintain copies of the appeals for their files and are able to reconstruct lost or misplaced appeals. Should the appeal paperwork be lost, the inmate appellant may proceed with his/her appeal issue to the next level with a duplicate copy of the appeal marked "treat as original".

It is the Department's perception that, rather than to facilitate the inmate appeals process, the proposed changes would thwart the existing process and overburden the copying process for those inmates in need of such services for court filings.

Both of the petitioners's suggested changes are therefore denied.
